

LACQUERED SPRUCE 3-PLY WOOD



CLEANING AND CARE INSTRUCTIONS

Lacquered spruce 3-ply wood provides reliable everyday protection thanks to its sealed surface. However, proper care is still necessary to maintain its natural appearance and functionality over time. Below are our recommendations for cleaning and maintenance.

General Cleaning

- Remove dust and light dirt using a dry or slightly damp cotton cloth or a soft leather cloth. Then wipe dry.
- Fresh stains (e.g., from drinks, food, fingerprints) should be wiped off immediately with a slightly damp cloth. If needed, add a drop of mild dish soap or neutral soap. Follow up by wiping with a slightly damp cloth and then drying.
- Do not use microfiber cloths, as they can act abrasively on lacquered surfaces and may cause fine scratches. Avoid aggressive cleaning agents (e.g., those containing alcohol, acetone, acids, or bleach), as they can permanently damage the surface.

Stains & Minor Damage

- Small scratches can be gently polished out using a suitable furniture care product or a colorless furniture polish. Use these products no more than once a year to avoid greasy buildup.
- Small chips should be repaired promptly to prevent moisture from penetrating. Clear lacquer or a matching touch-up pen is suitable for this purpose. Lightly sand and clean the area before repairing.
- A clean eraser can help remove light stains. When used gently, it won't damage the lacquer layer. Alternatively, use a drop of mild soap on a soft cotton cloth.

Recommended Protective Measures

- Regularly inspect the furniture for minor damage and dirt.

Basic Rule

- The sooner stains are removed, the easier they are to clean.
- Always test cleaning agents and methods on an inconspicuous area, such as the under side, before applying them more broadly.
