

Whiteboard surface



CLEANING AND CARE INSTRUCTIONS

First time use

- Remove the protective film
- Apply whiteboard cleaner to a clean cloth and wipe the board with it
- Wipe off any residue with clean, warm water
- Dry the surface with a dry cloth.

General cleaning instructions

- Wipe the surface with whiteboard cleaner or warm water.
- Wipe off any residue with clean, warm water.
- Dry the surface with a dry cloth.
- Surfaces that are rarely used should be cleaned two to three times a week. Surfaces that are used more frequently should be cleaned daily.

Removing permanent markers

- To quickly and easily remove permanent markers, write over them with a dry-erase marker. Then clean the surface. If stronger cleaning properties are needed: moisten a clean, dry cloth with alcohol.
- To remove the marker residue, clean the surface in circular motions, wash with clean water and dry with a dry cloth.

Removing metal scratches or stubborn residue

- Dampen a dry, clean cloth with water.
 - Apply a small amount of a cleaner containing an abrasive agent to the cloth.
 - Work on small sections at a time and clean the surfaces with back-and-forth movements and gentle pressure.
 - Wipe off any residue with a dry cloth.
- Soap residue on the surface reduces the dry-cleaning properties. Therefore, thoroughly rinse the surface with clean water and dry with a clean cloth.

Recommended accessories

- Use high-quality whiteboard pens that can be easily wiped off.
- Replace pens before they dry out to avoid poor erasability.
- Replace the erasing felt regularly. If the felt or board eraser is contaminated, the board will be harder to wipe clean.
